Summary

Remember the Lusitania! tells the story of one of the most pivotal and tragic events of World War I. The Lusitania, a luxury liner, was torpedoed by a German U-boat off the coast of Ireland on the afternoon of May 7, 1915. This was just 3 years after the sinking of the *Titanic*. Over 1,200 people were killed, including 128 Americans. This incident was instrumental in the U.S. decision to join the war 2 years later. This remarkable account of the shipboard experiences of three children who survived the disaster will intrigue young readers. Preston's remarkable storytelling includes vivid and thought-provoking details. Historical documents, firsthand accounts and personal interviews provide the basis for this enthralling account of one of the most disastrous shipwrecks in history and one of the most significant events of World War I.

Author's Biography

Remember the Lusitania! is Diana Preston's first book for children. It follows the publication of her best-selling book Lusitania: An Epic Tragedy, written for adults. Other popular books written by Preston are The Boxer Rebellion and A First Rate Tragedy: Robert Falcon Scott and the Race to the South Pole. Diana and her husband Michael Preston co-authored A Pirate of Exquisite Mind, a biography of the 17th-century British explorer, naturalist, pirate and buccaneer William Dampier. Diana Preston has been called a "fascinating" storyteller with "an obvious addiction to the details of history" (The Washington Post).

Diana Preston and her husband are avid travelers. They have traveled over several continents, climbed Mount Kilimanjaro, tracked gorillas in Zaire and camped their way across the Namibian desert.
