Ida B...and Her Plans to Maximize Fun, Avoid Disaster, and (Possibly) Save the World by Katherine Hannigan. Greenwillow Books, 2004. 246 p.

Summary

With the artful use of first person narration, Hannigan conveys the character of an unforgettable young heroine, who is very intelligent, highly spirited and imaginative. Ida B Applewood, an only child, lives with her parents on their Wisconsin farm and apple orchard. She talks to the brook and attaches notes onto miniature rafts requesting information about the world beyond her farm and orchard. Her friends are the apple trees that she named Beulah, Pastel, and Henry VIII. Ida B is always planning for fun until family problems change her life. When her mother develops cancer, her parents are forced to send Ida B to public school rather than continuing to home school her. Ida B feels angry and betrayed because she had a miserable experience in kindergarten. She dreads going back to the public school, but her first day turns out to be better than she expected. However, she is devastated when her parents sell part of the orchard, and new people move onto the land. She does not know how she will live without her beloved trees. With some sage wisdom from a caring fourth grade teacher, as well as the unconditional love of her mother and father, Ida B slowly begins to adjust.
