Accompanying standards-based instructional materials for K-12 teachers will be created and accessible via the LCET Making Connections website. The LOUISiana Gumbo project is sponsoring the workshops.

WORKSHOP ON TEACHING WITH PRIMARY SOURCES AND USING THE LOUISIANA DIGITAL LIBRARY

Primary Sources across the K-12 Curriculum: Integrating Primary Sources and Technology with Content Instruction. This one-day workshop provides teachers with the knowledge and tools for integrating primary artifacts (paintings, documents, photography, research field notes, three-dimensional objects, lyrics, etc) with content instruction. Includes break-out sessions in which teachers construct artifact-rich, standards-based activities for use in K-12 math, science, art, language, and social studies classes. Participants earn six contact hour Continuing Learning Units (CLUs)
