The WebPAC, or web-based public access catalog, allows you to search for RC, large print and descriptive video titles in the SBPH collection from any computer with Internet access. You can request books with the click of a mouse, check which items are charged to your account and see which are on their way to you. This new service is great for those folks with home computers who want to manage their own accounts. However, your friendly Reader Advisors will still be available to answer questions and assist in selecting books. The catalog is located on the library's website http://www.state.lib.la.us/ under the heading "Visually Impaired" then "Online Catalog." Anyone can browse the catalog, but a password is required to access your personal account information. The selection of Hamilton is the result of an extension national search conducted by the State Library Board of Commissioners, chaired by Paulett Holahan.


