Louisiana Libraries and IMLS Support: How IMLS Funding Impacts Louisiana

Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) funds the Grants to States Program by authorization of the Library Services and Technology Act. This annual grant distributes funding directly to states on a population basis. In Louisiana, the State Library of Louisiana carries out this grant. This funding is used for statewide projects that serve all citizens equally. Historically, the funding has averaged about \$2.4M per year. These funds pay for the following library programs:

- **Services for the Blind and Physically Handicapped** The Talking Books and Braille Library (TBBL) division of the State Library serves sight and hearing impaired residents and circulates **200,000 items annually**, including descriptive videos, large print books, big books, cassettes, digital books, and e-books.
- Statewide Electronic Resources These are provided free of charge by the State Library in partnership with the public libraries. The electronic resources provide comprehensive collections of business, health, literature, finance, science, arts, and humanities, as well as homework help, test preparation, and job and career services. They were used over 8 million times in 2015.
- HomeworkLouisiana This is an after-school online tutoring service for all Louisiana students. Tutoring is
 available in Spanish and Vietnamese as well as English. In 2016, students received over 20,000 hours of
 free tutoring. To date, this 7-year old popular program has provided over 333,000 tutoring sessions.
- CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS The State Library sponsors the Summer Reading Program and Louisiana Readers' Choice Awards. 89,000 children and teens participated in the 2016 Summer Reading Program. 22,000 elementary, middle, and high school students participated in the 2017 Louisiana Readers' Choice Awards reading almost 65,000 books and voting for their favorites.
- CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE) AND SUPPORT OF PUBLIC LIBRARIES State Library staff provide guidance and support
 to public library staff, directors, and board members, as well as webinars and workshops on a number of
 topics. Last year, staff answered 13,176 inquiries and held over 100 classes that trained 2,365 library staff.
 IT staff also offer technology support which includes assistance with upgrading network infrastructure,
 telecommunications issues, upgrading software and hardware, and guiding decision-making related to new
 technology.
- INTERLIBRARY LOAN (ILL) AND STATEWIDE COURIER SERVICE This allows the sharing of library materials among all
 public and academic libraries in the state. Among the public libraries alone, over 80,000 items are shared
 each year.
- LOUISIANA BOOK FESTIVAL This annual event draws in tens of thousands of participants and provides an economic benefit of \$2M to the Baton Rouge area. It is an internationally-recognized book festival, highlighting Louisiana's unique literature and culture.
