• State funding \$4,972,828

• Interagency transfers \$821,436

• Self-generated \$90,000

• <u>Federal funds</u> \$2,689,040


• Total budget \$8,573,304





FY 23-24 benefits to public libraries


- New hires at State Library: communications director, library consultants
- 45 of 48 positions filled; funding for all
- Database money remains in budget; no payments this year
- Additional funds for I.T. upgrades and statewide delivery



- Senate Bill 7 passed; governor signed on June 28


SB 7 summary:

- Each library shall adopt a policy to limit access of minors to sexually explicit material
- Policies must be adopted by Jan. 1,
 2024; implemented by June 1, 2024




Policy has to include:

- A requirement that a community standard be applied to materials acquired by the library
- A library card system that allows parents to select whether the minor can check out sexually explicit material




Policy has to include:


- A library card system that requires parents to select whether the minor can check out digital content
- A procedure that allows a library patron to request a reconsideration of whether the materials should be included in collection accessible to minors



- This can be an amendment to existing policies
- This won't impose liability on library employees or library boards
- The governing authority may withhold payments if the library fails to adopt the policy; must give 60 days' notice before doing so




- State Bond Commission cannot approve tax millage or bond propositions for libraries not in compliance
- SLOL will work with libraries on policies and procedures







- Utah Braille Library now distributing Braille eReader to our registered Braille patrons

- BARD: 49% of circulation
- Duplication of magazines on cartridges coming in December



THE LOUISIANA COLLECTION

- Hosted Louisiana Digital Library Festival
- Acquired genealogy journals from Secretary of State
- Obtained microfilm for Morning
 Advocate, State-Times to replace aging
 collection



Library Development

- Returning to site visits; goal to visit all by year's end
- New staff: Michele Jones (institutions) and Deidra Douglas (continuing education)



Library Development

- More than 1,900 attendees for 97 workshops in 2023
- More than 4,200 reference requests in 2023



Library Development

- Visited 6 of 8 state prisons in coordination with Access
 Services
- Training for prison library staff



Telehealth Grants

- \$50,000 in grants from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana Foundation
- 11 libraries selected as recipients
- Used for privacy booths, internet connections, software and hardware, and more




Access Services




Technical Services

Moved to Polaris ILS on Oct. 13, 2023

Patrons can:

- Navigate catalog on phone, tablet, or computer
- Use Smart Searches, which have spellcheck, automated search suggestions, and option to see related keywords to their search
- Choose to renew material automatically three days before due



Technical Services

- Enable reader history to keep track of what you've checked out
- Create reading lists
- Supports behind-the-scenes library
 operations such as cataloging, acquisitions,
 patron records, and more









Louisiana Readers' Choice Awards
