Total Budget	\$7,238,498




## FY 20-21 Budget

- Are unable to fill vacancies.




#### **State Library Staffing History**



#### Timeline

- March 11
  - World Health Organization (WHO) designates COVID-19 worldwide pandemic
  - Governor John Bel Edwards issues first declaration of Public Health Emergency
- March 13
  - Governor John Bel Edwards issues second declaration
  - State Librarian holds staff meeting outlining COVID-19 plans
  - SLOL begins updating Louisiana Public Library Emergency Status Blog



# Timeline (con't)

- March 13
  - Libraries statewide begin contacting SLOL
    - Alternate hours/closures
    - Service adaptions
      - Curbside/Virtual programs
- March 23
  - Statewide Stay at Home order for Louisiana begins
- May 15
  - Louisiana enters phase 1

- June 5
  - Louisiana enters phase 2
- September 21
  - Louisiana enters phase 3

#### Hurricane Laura

- 30 libraries throughout the state with damage
  - Roof damage
  - Broken windows
  - Flooding
  - Leaks
  - AC units destroyed
  - Collection damage
- 59 libraries without power

## Cameron Parish Library

  - Emergency Status Blog




### **State Library Services**

- The State Library reopened the 1<sup>st</sup> floor to the public on June 5 offering reference, circulation, & public computer use.
- Our schedule remains the same: Monday through Thursday, 10 am to 2 pm.
- "Call Ahead/Pickup" service added.
- Telephone/email assistance
- Talking Books assistance, readers' advisory services, and materials to TBBL patrons
- Electronic resources, such as EBSCO, HomeworkLouisiana, etc. available 24/7
- Wi-fi available outside of the building 24/7.

#### **IMLS CARES Act Funds 2020**

- The State Library was allocated \$420,058 out of the \$30 million given out through the IMLS Grants to States Program.
- It was evenly distributed by parish to the 340 public libraries in LA to be used
  - To expand digital network access, purchase internet accessible devices, and provide technical support services.
  - To address digital inclusion and related technical support.



#### **IMLS CARES Act Funds 2020**

- WiFi hotspots, laptops, and Ipads for circulation
- Digital collection increases (e-books, audios, etc.)
- New public computers and large screen monitors for special populations
- Equipment to produce online educational programs
- Large screens/monitors to do outdoor showings of educational programs and for outreach







This year's participants read over 68,353 books.






