

STEM Librarian / Assistant Librarian
12 month, Tenure – Track Position

The Noel Memorial Library invites applications for the position of STEM Librarian, a full-time, 12-month tenure-track faculty position, reporting to the Chair of Research and Instruction Services. The ideal candidate should be innovative and student-centered. The STEM librarian will provide instruction in the areas of biology, chemistry, computer science, physics, and general sciences as related to academic programming at the university. As a faculty member, the individual engages in library and university governance and scholarship, which includes research, scholarly, and creative activities required for tenure and promotion.

Responsibilities

- Provide reference and research services in a variety of formats.
- Develop, deliver, and assess library instruction to students.
- Collaborate with faculty to implement information literacy initiatives for the sciences.
- Conduct subject-specific research consultations.
- Assist with the development and implementation of assessment initiatives.
- Participate in and represent the library in outreach activities.
- Participate in multidisciplinary teams, library governance, professional development activities, and university service.
- Performs library related duties as assigned.

Required Qualifications

- Master's degree from an ALA accredited program is required at time of appointment

Preferred Qualifications

- Undergraduate or graduate degree or equivalent work experience in a STEM field
- Experience with assessment to ensure continuous evaluation and improvement
- Experience or coursework with designing, promoting, and integrating library services and resources to support research, teaching, and learning of STEM disciplines
- Experience in delivering information literacy instruction
